



### C&E data from Europe

A concept to include C&E data in EURISCO, developed by the ECPGR Documentation and Information Network (see <u>http://www.epgris3.eu/</u>):

- **Simple exchange format** containing: Experiment; Trait; Genotype; Score in order to gather whatever nonstandardized C&E data already exists
- **Uploading mechanism** (aligned with current EURISCO upload mechanism)
- **Downloading mechanism** (to be adapted to different user group needs)



# ECPGR towards Phase IX

- Independent External Review July 2010
- 12<sup>th</sup> SC meeting, Bratislava December 2010
- 13<sup>th</sup> SC meeting, Vienna December 2012
- Tender process: Oct 2012 March 2013



# ECPGR towards Phase IX (13<sup>th</sup> SC meeting, Vienna 2012)

- Phase IX of ECPGR will be launched (2014-2018) with an approved budget of 2,5 M Euro
- New objectives (logframe to be completed)
- New operational structure
- New rules of procedure and terms of reference of ECPGR bodies
- Secretariat will be hosted by the Global Crop Diversity Trust in Bonn, Germany, as of 1 January 2014
- EURISCO will be hosted by IPK, Gatersleben, Germany



### ECPGR objectives (Phase IX)

#### Long-term Goal:

National, Sub-regional and Regional Programmes in Europe rationally and effectively conserve *ex situ* and *in situ* PGRFA and increase their utilization



### Objectives of ECPGR – outcomes of Phase IX

- 1. AEGIS is operational and accessions are characterized and evaluated
- Functionality of EURISCO ensured (data quality & quantity + in situ data)
- 3. In situ and on-farm conservation concepts are agreed
- 4. Relations with users of germplasm are strengthened
- 5. Commitment and regular resources from donors are increased
- 6. Secretariat support is adequate to sustain operations of ECPGR



### New Operational Structure - 1

- Networks are eliminated
- 21 Working Groups (18 crop and 3 thematic WGs)
- WGs, composed of pools of experts proposed by NCs, carry out activities mandated by the SC or proposed by the WG (through the Chair) and approved by the SC
- Terms of Reference of Chair to be revised role will be strengthened



### New Operational Structure - 2

- Proposals for activities evaluated and approved every 6 months by ExCo
- Each activity typically will not exceed Euro 15,000 and the participation of 12 members, selected on the basis of "expressions of interest", plus selffunded participants
- A country quota system is maintained



### Ongoing preparation for Phase IX

- Two Task Forces on "Crop Wild relatives" and on "Onfarm conservation" have been set up to work on respective ECPGR concepts to be approved by the Steering Committee
- A Task Force to discuss the engagement of germplasm users in ECPGR activities is being set up
- A strategy to enhance relationship with the EU has been approved
- Plans for a meeting of the Doc&Info WG, aimed at clarifying the role of CCDBs and EURISCO (mid-2014)



#### Conclusion I – Challenges of Phase IX

- 1. Uncertain/reduced financial commitment of a few countries in Phase IX
- 2. Establishment and effective operation of Secretariat in new environment
- 3. New ECPGR mode of operation to be tested/ implemented
- 4. Need to maintain regional cohesion by better exploiting sub-regional skills and resources



### Conclusion II – Opportunities of Phase IX

- European Collection is taking off: it can become the focus for the regional 'state of the art' of ex situ conservation (including capacity building)
- 2. Agreement on in situ and on-**farm conservation "concepts"** will strengthen collaboration
- 3. Further development of EURISCO, including its relationship with the CCDBs, to better serve the WG needs
- 4. Dialogue and collaboration with EC to be strengthened
- 5. Dialogue with users to be strengthened (phenotypinggenotyping and genebanks)
